This change took place in mid November 2019 and resulted in having to mesh together two different statistical reporting systems.

COVID-19 & THE BLRL RESPONSE

THE LIBRARY'S COVID POLICIES HAVE BEEN 100% EFFECTIVE: To date, there has not been a single COVID case reported to be spread through the our library's services. The BLRL made swift changes to how we were working for our communities. Below are a few of the ways we maintained safe effective library services to our patrons.

- **1. DEVELOPED VIRTUAL PROGRAMS:** All library programming was conducted off-site, outside, or virtually to comply with social distancing recommendations to keep our patrons health protected. We focused on expanding video capabilities and developed engaging online content.
- **2. DISINFECTING ALL MEDIA BEFORE IT WAS BORROWED:** Every single book or other media was quarantined and chemically disinfected prior to being put back into the hands of our patrons. By taking this step between each check-out COVID was not able to be passed from patron to patron or staff.
- **3. REQUIRING MASKS:** Everyone using the library has been required to protect their fellow patrons by wearing a mask while in the library. Both Library Staff and visitors cooperation helped us all to stay safe.
- **4. EXTENSIVE REGULAR DISINFECTION OF ALL SURFACES IN THE LIBRARY:** Library staff members have worked very hard utilizing rigorous cleaning schedules and conducting spot cleaning after each patron use of computers and other equipment. Also, social distancing measures been taken in all branches.
- **5. ENCOURAGING ONLINE SERVICES:** From the start, the library expanded Hoopla and other online resources so our patrons could access e-books and other media free of charge during the lockdown. We added or expanded over a dozen online resources since the outbreak of COVID. The library also opened our WiFi services to give everyone in our community 24 hour access to the Internet even while the library was closed. The BLRL also created the e-card program that allowed people across Barry and Lawrence counties to get access to the library even if they didn't have a current library card.

COVID LOCKDOWN & STATS FOR 2019-2020:

The library district was closed from March 17, 2020 to May 17, 2020 due to the COVID-19 quarantine. Our libraries opened May 18 through May 30 with curbside delivery and computer use by appointment. The BLRL reopened to the public on June 1, 2020 with limited hours, days, and limited number of patrons per location. This resulted in obvious suppressed statistics across the board.

TECHNOLOGY:

In the spring to help during the COVID-19 closure, we extended Wifi services outside the library on an open wifi network. Wifi is available 7 days a week from 6 a.m. to 11 p.m. and can be accessed from the parking lot or sidewalk at each branch location.

We migrated our integrated library system to a new service called Evergreen with a "go live" date of November 14, 2019. Along with the new computer system to check books in and out we also gained the ability to participate in the Evergreen Consortium of over 50 libraries across the state. Patrons can now request materials from any of the participating libraries for free and they are delivered using the statewide courier service. Patrons now have access to over 2 million items as a result!

A high-quality, on-trend arts and crafts resource called "Creative Bug" was added to our suite of virtual assets in April 2020 to help patrons keep busy during the closure.

GRANTS:

We were awarded an LSTA Technology Mini Grant to purchase 20 desktop computers and monitors to replace aging office computers and a LSTA Technology Grant to purchase 8 AWE touchscreen computers pre-loaded with games for children. These grants paid for 75% of the overall cost with the library paying the remaining 25%.

We received a Reading Challenge Software Grant to purchase "Wandoo Reader" from Demco to help us with the Summer Reading Program in 2020.

We received a Summer Reading Grant from the State Library to help with our 2020 Summer Reading Club.

We purchased 30 T-Mobile Hotspots with funds from the Cares Act. These funds were distributed by the State Library. We will circulate 29 of these hotspots to our patrons and keep one for staff use.

We received Cares Act reimbursement funds from both Barry and Lawrence Counties for personal protective equipment, cleaning supplies, misc. supplies, and deep cleaning of branches due to the pandemic.

MAINTENANCE:

We had several maintenance projects in 2019-2020 that benefited several of our branch libraries.

The Aurora Branch received new flooring in the meeting room, lower hallway, and staff lounge. We also painted the wall behind the service desk and in the meeting room.

The Cassville Branch meeting room, basement hallway, storytime room, and the back wall in the adult book area were painted. New vinyl plank flooring was installed in the meeting room, storytime room, behind the service desk, and in the staff office.

At the Marionville Branch, the concrete block wall at the back of the building was completely replaced.

The Monett Branch received a new roof in August 2020.

The Pierce City Branch hallway and bathroom flooring was replaced. We also replaced two toilets and one of their heating/cooling pump units.

BUILDING PROJECTS:

The BLRL is committed to re-imagining all 9 library facilities in the coming years, with a plan for renovation, remodeling, and new construction projects on the horizon.

We completed several tasks in preparation for building a new Monett Branch Library:

At the end of Summer 2019 we surveyed non library users in Monett to see what types of services they felt were important in a new library. The top three things that they wanted to see were a dedicated children's area, more books (especially popular titles), and more and better programs for adults and seniors.

We contracted with Paragon Architecture for programming and conceptual design services for the new branch.

STAFF DEVELOPMENT:

Youth Services Coordinator Janea Coker, Collection Development Manager Rhonda Duff, and Library Executive Director Gina Milburn attended the Public Library Association Conference in Nashville, TN in February 2020.






